**GENEVIEVE** sang in a choir, played basketball and was attending her second year!  
**HELENE COLGAN** was in her final year and planned to do her Master's degree  
She was a mechanical engineer, with job offers numbering three!

**NATHALIE CROTEAU** was a graduating mechanical engineer  
She was planning a two week Mexican vacation with **HELENE**, her peer.  
**BARBARA DAIGNEAULT** was a teaching assistant to her dad  
Unfortunately she lost her life just before her grad.

**ANNE-MARIE EDWARD** was full of life and only twenty-one  
She loved skiing, diving, hanging out with her friends and having fun.  
**MAUDE HAVIERNICK** was a graduate of environmental design  
Who would have thought she'd lose her life at twenty-nine

**BARBARA MARIA KLUCZNIK** came to Montreal in 1987 from Poland  
She was a first year nursing student, who left behind a grieving husband.  
**MARYSE LAGANIERE** is the only non-student who lost her life  
She was only twenty-five and had just become a wife.

**MARYSE LECLAIR** was in her fourth year of metallurgy, she still had a year to go  
She was one of the school's top students; her future had a very bright glow.  
**ANNE-MARIE LEMAY** was twenty-seven and attending her fourth year  
She was studying to become a mechanical engineer.

**SONIA PELLETIER** was the head of her class and only twenty-eight  
She lost her life the day before she was to graduate.  
**MICHELE RICHARD** was presenting a paper with **MAUD HAVIERNICK**  
her friend.

She was in her second year of engineering materials when her life came to an end.

**ANNIE ST. ARNEAULT** was a mechanical engineering student from a small  
Quebec town  
She was in her last class before graduation when she was shot down.  
**ANNIE TURCOTTE** was a swimmer, a diver, an athletic gentle soul  
She went into engineering to improve the world as a whole.

In addition to the fourteen women who died thirteen others were hurt  
The news of this violence put the whole country on alert.  
We are here to remember and to honour their lives  
And to provide some awareness of violence against so many mothers, sisters and wives!!
